of Oz, May 13 -22 at the Kauffman Center for the Performing Arts. When this \$1 million ballet premiered in October 2018, it was met with huge acclaim and rave reviews. Every aspect of this ballet has been custom designed and created to wow audiences including choreography by **Septime Webre**, the creator of *Alice (in wonderland)*, music composed by **Matthew Pierce**, set design by **Michael Raiford**, costume design by **Liz Vandal**, lighting design by **Trad A Burns**, puppet design by **Nicholas Mahon**, and projection design by **Aaron Rhyne**. After it first premiered in Kansas City in October 2018, *The Wizard of Oz* then traveled to Colorado Ballet and the Royal Winnipeg Ballet for their companies' premieres and were met with world acclaim. The production will be accompanied by Kansas City Symphony conducted by Kansas City Ballet Music Director **Ramona Pansegrau**.

Kansas City Ballet Artistic Director **Devon Carney** stated, "With this final production of this season we invite audiences to join our talented company as they embark on a breathtaking and delightful journey, and finally share unexpected comradery on the yellow brick road. It's an incredible production, proven to be a crowd favorite. What's not to love?"

The scale and grandeur of the production is impressive.

- At least 120 people, not including dancers, were part of this collaboration team including designers and makers.
- In Kansas City, 30 company dancers and 24 second company dancers make up the cast, not counting children.
- There are 23 children's roles and two casts for a total of 46 children performing in *The Wizard of Oz*, providing a huge asset to the development and growth of the Kansas City Ballet School.
- The musical score composed by Matthew Pierce, the same composer for *Alice (in wonderland)*, is 471 pages long.
- There are 120 stunning costumes and 112 hats in the production. The costume shop paints 220 shoes. There are at least 60 costume changes during the production.
- There are upwards of 20 puppets including a mechanical Toto.
- More than 300 light cues take place using over 1000 channels of lights.
- There are eight flying effects by FOY executed by multiple characters.
- The animated projections, using a combination of three state-of-the-art projectors, add an integral design element that helps provide atmosphere and dimensionality to enhance the experience.
